Lesson 3 – Who, On Earth, Is The Holy Spirit?

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Introduction

Who is the Holy Spirit? Notice that our question is not "What is the Holy Spirit?" but rather "Who is the Holy Spirit?" Some people think of the Holy Spirit as a lifeless entity or an inanimate influence, but the Word of God describes Him as a person—a divine member of the Godhead.

I. <u>Misconcepts Exist</u>

a. The Holy Spirit is not an "it." The bible always speaks of the Holy Spirit in terms of "He."

"But when **He**, the Spirit of truth, comes, **He** will guide you into all the truth; for **He** will not speak on **His** own initiative, but whatever **He** hears, **He** will speak; and **He** will disclose to you what is to come." (John 16:13 emphasis mine)

- b. **The Holy Spirit is not a ghost.** A ghost is the spirit of the deceased, or an apparition, If the Holy Spirit is holy He is not a ghost; if He is a ghost He is not holy. The KJV was influenced by the Shakespearean era of ghosts and superstition.
- c. **The Holy Spirit is not merely the Word.** The bible is the inspired Word of God but it is not God! (Ephesians 6:17; 2 Timothy 3:15-17)
- d. The Holy Spirit is merely an influence. He is a real person and divine.

II. The Holy Spirit Is A Member Of The Trinity (Godhead)

- a. **The Trinity.** (Genesis 1:26-27; Matthew 28:18-20; 2 Corinthians 13:14)
- b. The Holy Spirit is Divine.
 - He is eternal (Hebrews 9:14)
 - He is omnipotent (Genesis 1; Micah 3:8; 1 Corinthians 12:4-11)
 - He is omniscient (1 Corinthians 2:10-11; 1 Timothy 4:1-3)
 - He is omnipresent (Psalms 139:7-10; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20)
- c. **God and the Holy Spirit are interchangeable.** (Acts 5:1-4; Romans 8:9; 1 Corinthians 3:16)
- d. The Holy Spirit is a Divine Person. The four facets of personality are...
 - Intelligence (1 Corinthians 2:10, 11; Romans 8:27; 1 Timothy 4:1-2).
 - Emotion (Isaiah 63:10; Romans 15:30; Ephesians 4:30).
 - Will (1 Corinthians 12:11; 1 Timothy 4:1; Romans 8:26; John 16:13).
 - Power (Acts 1; 2; John 15:26; Acts 8:29; 10:19; Revelation 22:17).

The Holy Spirit can be blasphemed (Matthew 12:31-32); lied to (Acts 5:3); resisted (Acts 7:51); grieved (Ephesians 4:30); insulted or despised (Hebrews 10:29); and quenched (1 Thessalonians 5:19). The actions of person are also seen. The Holy Spirit teaches and reminds (John 14:26); bears witness (John 15:26); guides into truth (John 16:13); speaks (John 16:13; 1 Timothy 4:1); hears (John 16:13); discloses (John 16:13); forbids (Acts 16:6); gives life (Romans 8:11); reveals (1 Corinthians 2:10; Ephesians 3:3-5); searches (1 Corinthians 2:10); promises (Galatians 3:14; Acts 2:33); fellowships (2 Corinthians 13:14; Philippians 2:1); intercedes (Romans 8:26-27); predicts (1 Peter 1:11); invites (Revelation 22:17) and leads (Luke 4:1; Romans 8:14).

III. The Holy Spirit Is To Glorify Christ

- a. When the Holy Spirit is at work Christ is glorified.
- b. The Holy Spirit is another paraclete (John 14-16).
- c. The Holy Spirit will never compete with Christ; He will complete Christ!
